Rights Respecting Schools

Last year, our school achieved the prestigious UNICEF Rights Respecting Schools Gold Award. This was the culmination of many years of

dedication to promoting the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child.

Lots of parents have asked for more information about this award, and the work that we do towards it. In a nutshell, the 42 Rights, enshrined in the Convention, form the basis of our curriculum and are at the heart of our school's mission statement.

At Barley Fields, we teach **about rights, through rights and for rights.** To help parents understand more about the UNCRC, we have decided to promote a 'Right of the Month' in our newsletters.

We start with **Article 2** - **No Discrimination**:

The Convention states the following:



All children have all these rights, no matter who they are, where they live, what language they speak, what their religion is, what they think, what they look like, if they are a boy or girl, if they have a disability, if they are rich or poor, and no matter who their parents or families are or what their parents or families are or what their parents or families believe or do. No child should be treated unfairly for any reason.

This is something we whole-heartedly believe in at Barley Fields Primary School, and we regularly talk about the importance of Article 2 in our lessons and our assemblies. Look out for the 'Right of the Month' in our next newsletter.

School Uniform

On our return to school for Summer term we will move into our summer school uniform. This inlcudes red

E-Safety Reminder



A reminder to all parents and carers for the need for

vigilance regarding what children are accessing or posting online. In school, our children are protected by our robust firewall and filtering and monitoring system supplied by SECURLY but, we still actively teach about the importance of keeping safe online. In the past, we have been made aware of children (some as young as 5) who have their own, open YouTube channels and who have posted videos and images of themselves publicly online.

Although social media is an inescapable fact of modern life, can I please urge parents and carers to again ensure that all children's accounts on any online platform, including those used for gaming, are fully safeguarded and only accessible and discoverable by known family and trusted friends.

Parents are advised to regularly view and check anyone who is liking or viewing these pages, or who is being included in games and chat groups. On our school website 'e-safety' page there are lots of easy to follow information leaflets to download providing parents with guidance on setting parental controls across a range of games, platforms and devices. These can also be obtained from the National Online safety website at https://nationalonlinesafety.com/ Please take the time to do this, as dangers to our children are out there. In the past we have occasionally come across serious safeguarding concerns on platforms and games that our children are involved in and I would hate to think these ever developed into serious issues.
